Just 30 years ago... On Aug. 2, 1990, Saddam Hussein led a well-equipped Iraqi army into Kuwait, an ally and major oil supplier of United States. 






Trumpeter's 1/72nd scale Marine Command LAV. I am building this for a 30th Desert Storm anniversary build in the group All Things Scale. I was not thrilled to see it was 1/72nd when I expected 1/35th. LOL. Anyway, I can't get over the parts count for this little thing, and the number of those that are nearly invisible to the eye. Well, mine, anyway.

Kit actually has separate vinyl tires and 3 sets of different hub styles! There are 24 parts to the undercarriage, axles, springs, etc. Before mounting the props to the hull, it needed to paint them Tamiya's "Light Sand". Used a a light application of brown panel liner to the hubs to just pick out detail.

Every part has had at least one trip to the floor, as they don't like tweezes too much. Today alone, was five floor trips to install nine antennae to the roof. It is a nice little vehicle, and not that time consuming. The worst part has been removing sprue "gates" which are mostly larger than the part they held.





The old raised panel lined Monogram 1/48th A-10 "Thunderbolt II" (better known as the "Warthog"). Paint by Tamiya sprayed thru an Iwata Eclipse, markings: Superscale sheet #48-432 "Desert Storm A-10 Warthogs". One "non-standard issue" Sidewinder is to be added to right wing rack.

Turret Modifications

- Barrel drilled out, PE rifling added
- MRS hood hollowed out
- · Interior baffles and coaxial MG added to mantlet
- Tie downs replaced
- Smoke dischargers replaced with plastic rod
- · Kit cammo net basket replaced with PE
- · Lift eyes drilled out
- TOGS barbette opened, TISH, PE door, and top detail added
- Commander's day/night sight reshaped, opening and PE door added
- Commander's MG drilled out, spotlight added
- · Chieftain bin added to left side
- Scorpion bin added to right side
- Gunner's sight cover removed and repositioned
- Missing antenna mount and command antenna mount added

Turret Modifications (cont.)

- Covers and rails added to stowage bins
- GPS mast added
- · Wire added to reel
- Lift lugs added to turret rear
- · Welds added to front lift lugs
- · Battery hatch handles undercut
- Loader's hatch hinges underscored
- · Rall replaced with brass rod, ID sign and water cans added
- Loader's periscope added

Hull Modifications

- Tools on nose armor underscored
- Nose armor attachment bolts added
- · Missing tow lug added to lower glacis
- Headlights drilled out, lenses and PE guards with horn added
- · Marker light hoods drilled out, lenses added
- Fire extinguisher system pulls added
- Handle added to driver's hatch
- Tow cables replaced with wire, keepers added from bits of PE fret
- Water can racks added
- Exhaust openings scribed

Hull Modifications (cont.)

- Latch detail added to stowage locker
- · Railing added to rear corners
- Travel lock underscored
- · Tow draw bar segmented
- Tool stowage reworked and detailed, pry bar added, shovel and pick handles underscored, pick head reshaped, brackets and pins added
- Fuel drum latches underscored, caps added
- Clearance between inner road wheels and torsion arms scored-in
- Suspension arm pivots reshaped

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The kits new valence and bumper, at left, replace the awful government mandated 1973 5-MPH impact bumper, as shown at right, on AMT's previous '71 Mach 1 kit attempt, my last completed car kit. Thank's, Round2!





I like the kit provided dash and instrument clusters, of AMT's <u>previous</u> '71 Mach 1 release, shown above. The new Red parts are great for collectors, but not builders.

So, how to proceed, to build my not-quite restored '71 Mach 1? Engine was the Cleveland H.O. 351 C.I.D., with operating Ram Air. I had added Hooker headers & Turbo-Flow mufflers. These power adding items could only be acquired after shelling out for replacing the rusted-out front frame & repairing an air-shock penetration of the trunk floor, just to pass inspection.

Comparatively, it will be rather inexpensive to replace the kit's 289 C.I.D. mill with the 351 from an AMT 1973 Cougar, if I can find one. My spare parts box contains plenty of dual exhaust components. The 007 '71 Mach 1 kit's hood does not include the two stock hood pin closures my 1:1 Mach 1 did, but trial and error punching out thin plastic stock and foil should do the trick.

I will save time in finishing, by replacing all the red molded parts of the new kit, with those tan parts from the previous '71 kit, except for the "correcting" components: body, front bumper assembly, and grill.


