Painted tank with Mig Ammo acrylic "Green Moss", and tracks were weathered with several pigments including "Track Rust". Figure painted with Vallejo acrylics. The Mk I Whippet medium tanks were developed to operate alongside the Mk IV heavy tanks or to operate by themselves as cavalry tanks to raid behind German lines. Minutes of April 12 IPMS Richmond Virtual Chapter Meeting ...E.L. Motley, Secretary

Because of the ongoing Covid pandemic and restrictions on gatherings, IPMS Richmond cancelled all monthly chapter meetings for December, 2020, and January, February and March, 2021. On Monday, April 12, 2021, a virtual chapter meeting was held utilizing Jitsi. The meeting convened at 7:05 PM with eight members online and in attendance. Given the small number of members present, no business was conducted other than to express optimism that "live" IPMS-R meetings could soon resume at Smoketree.

The recent passing of two prominent IPMS members was announced. Our chapter's Tom Albright and Tidewater's Bill Brickhouse both died in February. Tom was a long-time member of IPMS Richmond and built outstanding car models. He also shared his building and painting techniques in a number of Spare Parts articles. Tom's loyal support of our chapter and our hobby continued though his struggle with lung cancer. We will greatly miss him.

Bill Brickhouse was practically a legend in the Virginia scale modelling community and built many trophy winning World War II aircraft models. He was always in attendance at the Old Dominion Open and other area hobby events and a great ambassador for IPMS and aircraft modelling. We extend our most sincere sympathy to Bill's family and to IPMS Tidewater.

The rest of the meeting consisted of "Show & Tell" presentations. Tom Dailey is working on a 1/35 scale Italeri AB40 Italian armored car and also a 1/35 Italian Lancia truck mounting a Skoda howitzer. Painting of both models was underway using Vallejo acrylics and weathering techniques. Tom said he wanted the models to show the worn and sun faded look of many North Africa Campaign vehicles.

Gene Rasmussen presented three models, starting with a just for fun "egg" model of the *Titanic*. Gene also has a 19 inch tall Tamiya brachiosaurus dinosaur in the works and a huge and extensively detailed 1/8 scale model of a Nissan GTR. Gene's Nissan should be quite a car once completed.

Alex Valz is making steady progress on Tamiya's 1/48 P-38 F/G Lightning. This is the newest molding and probably the best 1/48 P-38 on the market. Alex is building the plane as one of the Yamamoto ambush aircraft. Alex is also building a Tamiya 1/35 early production Tiger I, using AFV tracks and other aftermarket parts.

Richard Leininger's 1/350 USS *Arizona* continues under construction. Richard has detailed the battleship's Kingfisher floatplanes and applied Scale Decks wooden decks.



Glen Martin's 1/48 Dragon Ju-188 is completed. Glen's subtle weathering techniques, combined with his meticulous masking and painting of the Ju-188's intricate large "greenhouse" cockpit canopy, have produced a most impressive model of this Luftwaffe stalwart.

With no other matters to cover, the members signed off and concluded the meeting.

Testors "UFO", Kit #555




