Minutes of October 11, 2021 Chapter Meeting...

Chapter President Mike Lyons called the meeting to order at 6:45 PM with 23 members and one visitor in attendance. The meeting began with progress reports on the 2022 Old Dominion Open.

Richard Leininger displayed our ODO First, Second and Third Place trophies which are medals. Richard is also building a special wooden tray or box for holding medals on Show Day. He met with our local trophy supplier about the design of our special ("Best of") awards. These special trophies will be upright acrylic plaques with engraved and etched details. Unlike the medals, the special award trophies will be dated and exclusive to the 2022 Old Dominion Open. The design and specifics for the special trophies are not yet final and we are awaiting an estimate from Crown Trophy. We still have ample time to make a decision and have the special trophies prepared and delivered.

Craig Norris announced that we have already sold 80 of 118 vendor tables and are receiving checks in payment. Additional table sales are forthcoming.

E. L. Motley has purchased our classified ad from *Fine Scale Modeler*. This ad will run in the January/February 2022 issue of the magazine, which will be out the first week of December.

Alex Valz presented the Treasurer's report and noted that some of the ODO's expenses, including the purchase of our medals, have been paid.

Mike Lyons announced that we have received a request from SFC [Sergeant] Daniel P. Farrell, who is stationed at Fort Bragg. Sgt. Farrell was an IPMS member when he was stationed in Virginia. He has requested model paint and supplies for troops at Fort Bragg and in Kuwait. After some discussion, Bob Walls made a motion that we donate a \$250.00 Hobby Town gift card to Sgt. Farrell's group at Fort Bragg (there is a Hobby Town store near Fort Bragg in Fayetteville, NC). This motion received multiple seconds and was passed unanimously.

Bob Walls also discussed our "U.S. Military Jeep" group build and invited members to participate. This group build is not a competition and is not part of the upcoming Old Dominion Open or any IPMS-R or CVAMPS contest. Any jeep models display would be a temporary one in the chapter's case at Hobby Town.

This group build is just for fun. Rules are few and are available in previous issues of *Spare Parts* and also on IPMS-R's social media platforms. Bob also plans a monthly e-mailing to group build participants.

Mike Lyons received information from Atlantic Models in Florida. Atlantic is a new company that makes custom decals in any scale. Check with Mike for details.

Our annual Christmas dinner and contest is scheduled for Monday, December 13, at Smoketree. The meal will be fully catered by Mike's brother. We will have chicken and pork barbecue, meat loaf, green beans, Brussel sprouts, macaroni & cheese and Krispy Kreme pudding. The chapter will provide soft drinks. Our contest theme will be "The Cold War: 1960-1970" with First, Second and Third place awards for models entered in that theme's category. As in past years, there will also be a "Best in Show" award.

Mike asked the membership for guidance in how much to spend on the December meeting's prize raffle. Gene Rasmussen moved for a \$500.00 limit. Scott Holtz seconded. This motion stalled on a voice vote that was inconclusive. Glen Martin moved to amend the motion by raising the limit to \$750.00. This amendment was seconded and after some discussion, was passed by a voice vote.

Tonight being our election night for 2021-2022 officers, Secretary E. L. Motley reported that he had received all ballots submitted. No offices were contested, no write-in votes were cast, and our officers will be Mike Lyons, President, Richard Leininger, Vice-President, Scott Wallace, Secretary, and Alex Valz, Treasurer. Gene Rasmussen made a motion to confirm the officers' election by acclamation. This motion was seconded and unanimously passed by voice vote.

Mark Elder displayed and discussed our new photo booth and related camera equipment for use at our meetings. This equipment will greatly improve the quality of our model photography appearing in our newsletter and on our social media.

Mike Lyons recognized and welcomed our visitor, John Mullins. John is an experienced figure modeler fond of old science fiction and 1950's and 1960's horror movies. He also brought and displayed several busts in this genre.

In our Show & Tell segment, ten modelers presented 16 models, including works in progress. The meeting then adjourned.

Our next chapter meeting will be Monday, November 8, 6:30 PM, at the Smoketree Community Center. We will have a kit raffle.




Tom's Bench Stuff 1: Tamiya 1/35 Kubelwagen Type 82 "Africa-Corps"

Scott's Bench Stuff: Airfix New-Tool 1/72 Hawker "Typhoon II", Completed!



Difficulties:

Decal wing roundels were a little out of register, I did not notice this until they were applied. I recommend replacing wing roundels with aftermarket decals.

The Yellow wing leading edge decals were difficult to lay down, but finally did after a lot of time and patience. I recommend painting these markings.



Additional Comments:

Kit was built out of box. No putty on glue seams required, fit was that good. Tamiya Acrylic Paints XF-81 "Dark Green (RAF)", XF-82 "Ocean Grey" (RAF), and XF-83 "Sea Grey 2" (RAF) were sprayed with Harder and Steenbeck airbrush, thinned with Tamiya's Acryl/Ply Thinner X-20A.

Remainder of markings were good, all decals worked well to application of Microscale Micro Set Solution and Micro Sol Solution. The wing and fuselage "Invasion Stripes" are decals and fit was right on!

Mark's Bench Stuff: Academy 1/48 MiG-21PF



The 1/48 MiG-21PF was Academy's first kit issued after their corporate split with Minicraft, and priced like contemporary Tamiya 1/48 models. Purchased long ago from The Hobby Center, kit features engraved panel lines, simple cockpit detailing, separate control surfaces and dive flaps, as well as choice of "early" or "late" vertical stabilizers. Kit has been superseded by the newer (and more \$) Eduard Mig-21 series release. Decals for Vietnam War's top (9 kills!) ace, Nguyen Van Coc, are provided, and in great shape. Coc's aircraft, "4326" was much like "4320", shown above. This, and my in-progress vintage Revell F-4D Phantom II, will (hopefully) compete as Cold War entries in December's chapter contest.


