
Meeting was adjourned at 8:40 pm.



#### Difficulties:

Only difficulty I had was deciding which of various kit-provided versions to build, as Croatia fought Serbia with Soviet and Warsaw-Pact built T-55's, which could vary significantly in minor but noticeable details. Decals were thick.

#### Additional Comments:

To accentuate cast turret, a stippled layer of Mr. Surfacer 1000 Putty was applied. The turret's prominent "handrails" were replaced with brass rod. Gun barrel is by Aber. The kit antenna and base were replaced with Aber (IIRC) made replacement. Friulmodel metal track replaced kit's rubber-band track and Hudson & Allen Tow Cables were used. Tamiya acrylic paints and Vallejo Green Armor Weathering paints/powders were applied, then sealed with Liquitex thinned Matt Medium sprayed thru Iwata Eclipse and Neo airbrushes. Camoflage scheme is based on T-55 delivery base paint with commonly seen "street applied" Brown added. Kit-bashed styrene and aftermarket stowage were added to turret. I purchased Duplicata 1/35 Croation flags, hoping to drape one on rear of turret as seen in many videos and images from the 1990's conflict. I could not fold, drape, or furl the paper flags in a realistic appearance, so gave up. I found a nice resin tent/tarp roll that was painted and affixed where the flag was to go, and am happy with that. Croatian national marking decals came from sources like Aeromaster and Karaya. As the Russian invasion of Ukraine continues, we can look back to another small country, Croatia, resisting the larger and better equipped Serbia, and beating the odds to win and retain its independence.





#### Difficulties:

Typical vintage Italeri armor kit is molded in Olive Drab instead of Medium Gray that other kit manufacturers have switched too. Yes, that's the only "difficulty", having to primer paint over a dark plastic. I did break the 50 calibre machine gun pintle mount by forcing it, but it really wasn't required on the tank I built, so left the weapon off.



#### Additional Comments:

Assembled kit out of box with Tamiya glue, filled seams with Tamiya White Putty, and applied Tamiya paints (even the new-to-me XF-86 Flat Clear Coat). Paints were thinned with Tamiya acrylic thinner, not the lacquer thinner so popular today. Markings are a Star Decals set of Southern NATO Pattons. I used the markings for a colorful outside display Portuguese M47 memorial. This build required no personal gear, or in-service weathering. Cookie Sewell did one of his no-photos (but very informative) reviews of this kit, giving it high marks, saying it may be Italeri's best scale model kit. That's good enough for me.

Having decided to build the Portuguese "Patton" featured on the Star decal sheet, the instructions depicted partial front and side views of an M47 with mantlet cover, I had resolved to purchase the Tamiya re-release of the Italeri kit (features an added mantlet cover). I discovered an on-line image of my subject with no mantlet cover, like the Italeri kit. Kit provided rubber band track were painted and stayed securely together after CA gluing the ends together. Best track of this type I've assembled. Radio antenna are brass rods, so its technically not an out of box build.

I spoke to Phil Lavender of Tiger Werke during the Feb. 26 O.D.O.. I had seen numerous award winning armor entries that were supported by beautiful hardwood and resin bases that he offered. It was time to abandon my use of "cheap craft store bases" as Alex Valz refers to them. Purchasing a nice stained Walnut base at the O.D.O. and receiving a free resin square glue bottle (Tamiya) holder GLU-Budy, I felt it necessary to give Tiger Werke's Phil Lavender a shout-out. In addition to the above. Teger Werke carries many resin diorama details, etc. Check them out on the website noted (Above Left) and abandon those cheap craft store wood bases.




