This build is at about 50% complete. I used Tamiya XF-89 "NATO Black" to prime the model. Came back with XF-60 "Dark Yellow" base coat. Then added XF-2 "White" to the XF-60 to panel shade. This is where I'm at right now. I will add XF-89 "Green 2" and XF-90 "Red Brown 2" to complete the camo scheme. Afterward, will weather as needed. Stay tuned.Scott
