Minutes of January 8, 2024, Meeting

President Glen Martin called the January meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Twenty-two members and officers were present.

Treasurer Ashley Abernathy reminded everyone that our \$10.00 annual dues are now due and payable for 2024. He also advised that he was working on our 2023 tax filings, which are done online.

Vice-President and Old Dominion Open Chairman Richard Leininger gave an update on the upcoming ODO. He stated that we finally have a contract with the Richmond Raceway management. The floor plan of the show venue is almost done, and Richard requested members to let him know what tasks they will be able to do on Show Day. He also said we will finalize job duties at the February 12 chapter meeting. This year, we will have the Model Geeks Podcast team at the show. Richard will do an interview with them in February, and they will post the interview prior to the Old Dominion Open.

Secretary Bob Walls requested that a decision be made whether we wanted to help the Deep Run Recreation staff with a spring youth camp at Deep Run Center on April 2, 2024. The response was positive; we will proceed with planning for that event.

Scott Oates addressed the meeting on his plans for our display case at Hobby Town. He also asked the winners in our December 2023 chapter contest to arrange to meet him at Hobby Town with their models so that he can assemble a display of winning entries.

The Show & Tell portion of the meeting was lighter than normal with eight models displayed by six members.

Mike Lyons ended the meeting with the kit raffle that was postponed from November.

The meeting adjourned just past 8:30 PM. Our next chapter meeting will be Monday, February 12, 2024, 6:30 PM, at Deep Run Park Recreation Center.



FRIDAY AFTERNOON, February 23 (Runs from 3:00-6:30 PM—we have to be out and hall locked up by 7:00 PM). Tables and chairs will be in place by RIR staff prior to this day.
Place tablecloths on contest area tables, organize and prepare awards area, front entrance, registration tables, prize drawing area, contest and vendor areas. Help vendors unload (Hand trucks are provided).
SATURDAY SHOW DAY, February 24
Help unload remaining vendors (7:00 AM). Hand trucks are provided and you will get early access to the hall and the vendors prior to doors opening to patrons.
Work on Registration team (Need teams to cover period from 8:00 AM to noon).
Work on General Admission team (Need teams to cover period from 8:00 AM to approx. 2:30 PM).
Front Hall Monitor. Monitors front door (opens to patrons at 8:30 AM), Keeps an eye on front hall, prize drawing and trophy areas.
Be a contest judge (first call for judges is around 10:00-10:30 AM).
Help vendors load up (starts about 3:00 PM).
Tear down and close hall. Take up tablecloths, fold and place in bins, pack up supplies in designated bins, clean up any left behind trash (Tables and chairs are broken down by RIR staff). Work begins during awards ceremony. We try to be out by 5:30, 6:00 PM at thelatest.


